

Low Tech Eye Gaze Board

They can look at what they want but they have no other voluntary movement.

What is it?

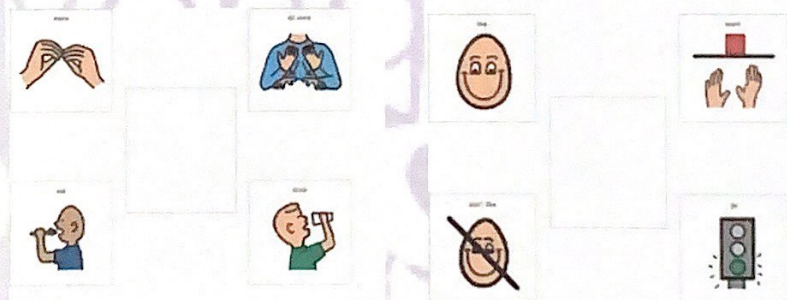
A low tech eye gaze board is a board that typically holds up to 9 pictures around an opening in the center of the board. The icons, letters, photos or symbols face the child and the communication partner looks through the opening to see where the child is looking.

Instructions:

1. Place two to four manipulatives (pictures) in the four corners of the black foam frame.
2. Say each one as you show the child the icon before placing them on the board.
3. Once on the board, point to each item and name them again.
4. Face the icon side toward the child and look through the opening in the middle of the board.
5. Model looking at all four quadrants.
6. Verbalize where you think they are looking.
7. Instruct them to look at the one they want.
8. When they hold their gaze on one icon (bubbles), say "Bubbles! You told me 'bubbles' ."

Ways to use:

- Choice making – toys, songs, people, food, etc.
- More and All Done
- Stop and Go
- Yes and No
- I like it / Don't like it
